### BLUE CIRCLE

The Blue Circle is the universal symbol for diabetes. The purpose of the diabetes symbol is to give diabetes a common identity. The icon was originally developed in 2006 for the campaign for a United Nations Resolution on diabetes. The campaign was a response to the diabetes pandemic that is set to overwhelm healthcare resources everywhere. It mobilised diabetes stakeholders behind the common cause of securing a United Nations Resolution on diabetes. The United Nations passed Resolution 61/255 'World Diabetes Day' on December 20 2006.

Until 2006, there was no global symbol for diabetes. The blue circle aims to:

- support all existing efforts to raise awareness about diabetes
- inspire new activities, bring diabetes to the attention of the general public
- brand diabetes
- provide a means to show support for the fight against diabetes

### Why a circle?

Across cultures, the circle can symbolize life and health. Most significantly for the campaign, the circle symbolizes unity. Our combined strength is the key element that made this campaign so special.

### Why blue?

The blue border of the circle reflects the colour of the sky and the flag of the United Nations. The United Nations is in itself a symbol of unity amongst nations and is the only organization that can signal to governments everywhere that it is time to fight diabetes and reverse the global trends that will impede economic development and cause so much suffering and premature death. All delegates will receive a free blue circle pin at the registration desks. Please wear the pin throughout the congress and unite with us for diabetes.

### MOBILITY AND ACCESSIBILITY

The compact island city is great for walking, and can easily and safely be explored on foot or by public transport. Quick, safe and clean, the metro connects downtown and the congress centre to major tourist attractions, as well as to numerous bus stops and train stations. From the downtown area, you can access the Montréal Underground Pedestrian Network, which is used by over 500,000 people daily. A bustling 30-kilometre network of walkways, featuring 1,700 shops, restaurants and an array of services, it connects to some 40 performance venues, theatres and cinemas, not to mention many hotels, attractions and museums.

Metro operating hours are Monday to Friday and Sunday from 5:30 a.m. to 1 a.m., and Saturday from 5:30 a.m. to 1:30 a.m. The average wait time between trains is eight minutes and three minutes during rush hour.

## Invited Speakers Programme

### *Debate (D)*

These will include sessions on controversial topics in the format of a discussion in which two opposing teams will defend and refute a given proposition.

### *Meet-the-expert (ME)*

These sessions will provide the opportunity for participants to interact with one or more experts on a specific topic.

### *Open Forum (OF)*

A topic of common interest will be introduced for discussion between a speaker and participants. Participants may put forth new ideas and questions to the speaker at any time.

### *Speakers' Corner (SC)*

These are informal sessions for the critical evaluation and analysis of a topic by the speaker.

### *Symposium (S)*

Symposia will include latest findings in diabetes research, and current issues in therapy and education, as well as exploring subjects related to the organizational, economic and personal impact of diabetes.

### *Teaching Lecture (TL)*

Recognized experts will give educational lectures on specified topics. This format will combine a lecture with audience interaction.

### *Workshop (WS)*

Workshops will include the discussion of specific topics accompanied by practical demonstrations, problem-solving or hands-on training sessions.

## Abstract Programme

### *Oral Presentation*

Some accepted abstracts will be chosen for oral presentations enabling authors to communicate their research to a global audience.

### *Posters*

Abstracts selected for poster discussion or presentation will be displayed from 10:00 until 17:00 (Monday-Wednesday) and from 10:00 until 14:00 (Thursday) in the Poster Area (Hall 220e).

Delegates should kindly note that posters will not be continuously kept up for the entire duration of the congress but will be rotated.

### *Poster Discussion*

An array of accepted abstracts will be chosen for poster discussion. Authors will present and discuss their findings with a small group. The sessions will take place from 12:00-13:00 and 13:00-14:00 (Monday-Wednesday) and are on a first-come-first-serve basis. Each session can only accommodate a maximum of 15 participants. Participants can collect a headset, in exchange for the provided voucher attached to the registration badge, 30 minutes prior to the session from the Poster Discussion Desk located in the poster area. The headset must be returned immediately after the session. In case of loss or damage a fee of 300 EUR will be charged to the delegate.

### *Poster Presentation*

A collection of accepted abstracts will be displayed as posters. Presenting authors should attend to their posters from 12:00-14:00.

## Session recording policy

No session may be recorded or broadcast in any format by any attendee. The congress does itself record some sessions with the presenter's consent for webcasting for up to one year afterwards. Use of digital cameras to record individual slides (for personal use) is discouraged, and no device should be used above head level. Use of photographs of slides in any subsequent publication or presentation or other distribution is a breach of copyright and may result in prosecution by the owner of the data or ideas. Use of flash is also forbidden.

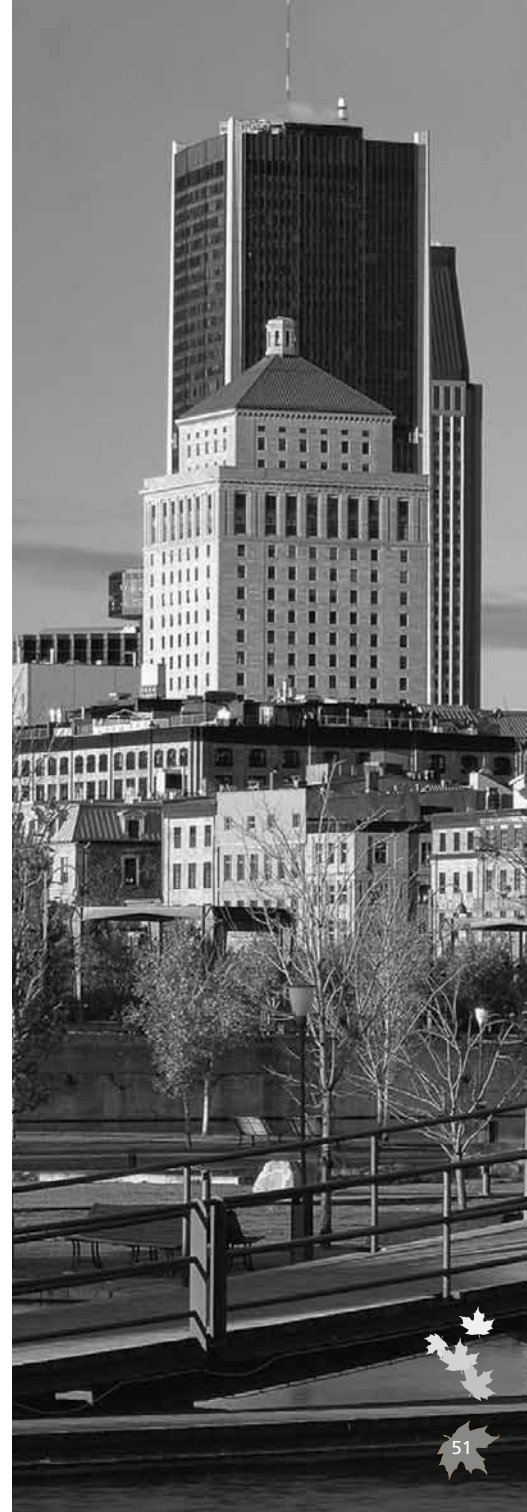
